Brookside Community Supports Southwest High School

After a rough 2010–2011 school year at the Southwest Early College Campus (SWECC), this year has seen encouraging changes. Many are due to the dedication of the school's principal Dr. Ed Richardson, who began last September, his staff, and the students themselves. Other changes have come about through the efforts of the SWECC Faith-Based Coalition, a grass roots group of Brookside-area churches seeking to provide community support for Southwest students and staff.

Coalition members include St. Peter's Roman Catholic Church, St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, Country Club Christian Church, Country Club United Methodist, Country Club Congregational United Church of Christ and Second Presbyterian Church. The ad hoc group, which meets monthly, has been involved in a myriad of activities ranging from sponsoring special faculty appreciation events, tutoring, helping in the library and on classroom projects, working with students on senior writing projects and even arranging a prom dress exchange. Additionally, the Wornall Road Baptist Church actively supports the school's promising athletic program, and community volunteers frequently accompany art department students on field trips to the Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art.

More than 100 volunteers are involved in Southwest activities. Students have responded by creating their own "Give Back Project" and are actively seeking community service hours.
